

Stavely Project Update

Due to the record rainfall in spring and early summer 2022, the exploration program, which was planned to commence in October 2022, had to be delayed to January 2023. This resulted in a very busy first few months for Stavely Minerals in 2023.

The 2022-2023 field campaign included diamond drilling searching for the deep copper-gold porphyry potential which we believe, produced the high-grade copper-gold Cayley Lode, along with regional exploration, including auger sampling and aircore drilling at other prospects located between Stavely to Willaura and Narrapumelap.

We managed to complete three of the four planned deep diamond drill holes looking for the deep coppergold porphyry. Despite four attempts, the fourth hole had to be abandoned at around 500m drill depth due to very broken ground, resulting in impossible drilling conditions. It is planned to drill this hole from a different direction in a hope of avoiding the problem zone.

Results from the regional field programs were evaluated, and we received sufficient encouragement from the aircore results at the S41 Prospect within the Willaura district to warrant the drilling of a diamond hole late in the season. Potentially a new gold-silver system has been identified at the S41 prospect. There is still a lot more work to be done at S41 to determine if it would ever be of economic significance.

We concluded our field works in late May 2023, and planning is underway for the next season when we will be back to continue drilling for the deep porphyry and testing our regional prospects.

We are thankful for the efforts of our field team and our Contractors, and are always grateful for the help and support from the community.
